

# Comparative Adjectives:

big	bigger	warm	warmer
small	smaller	cool	cooler
light	lighter	strong	stronger
cheap	cheaper	weak	weaker
fast	faster	cute	cuter
slow	slower	loud	louder
cold	colder	<b>easy</b>	<b>easier</b>
hot	hotter	<b>smart</b>	<b>smarter</b>
nice	nicer	<b>heavy</b>	<b>heavier</b>

**Example:** *I like dogs better than cats because dogs are smarter than cats.*

expensive	more expensive
popular	more popular
difficult	more difficult
intelligent	more intelligent
handsome	more handsome
famous	more famous
beautiful	more beautiful
exciting	more exciting
<b>fun</b>	<b>more fun</b>

**Example:**  
*I like Halloween more than Thanksgiving because Halloween is more exciting than Thanksgiving.*

## Example Dialogue:

Student 1: Which do you prefer [ A ] or [ B ]?

Student 2: I prefer [ A ] more than [ B ].

Student 1: Why?

Student 2: Well, I prefer [ A ] because they are [ adjective ].

Student 1: I see! So, you like [ A ] more than [ B ] because [ A ] are [ comparative adjective ] than [ B ].

Student 1: Which do you prefer apples or chocolate?

Student 2: I prefer apples more than chocolate.

Student 1: Why?

Student 2: Well, I prefer apples because they are healthier.

Student 1: I see! So, you like apples more than chocolate because apples are healthier than chocolate.
