### **D**. Explaining Visuals

**STEP 1 – Introduce** "This bar graph shows the GDP of Japan and Canada."

- **STEP 2 Explain** *"The vertical axis <u>shows</u> amount of rain. The horizontal axis <u>shows</u> the weekdays."*
- **STEP 3 Emphasize** "The key point on this pie chart is the high percent of people over 80."
- **STEP 4 Transition** "<u>Next, I will</u> talk about the sports teams of both countries."

Don't forget to use <u>good posture</u>, <u>eye contact</u>, <u>clear voice inflection</u>, <u>and gestures</u> when making your speech. Your speech should be delivered naturally without reading your notes.
