# Country Comparison Speech 

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The Country Comparison Speech is a speech that compares two countries. You will make a PowerPoint (slideshow) that uses FOUR data charts. The data charts will compare two countries based on FOUR points of comparison. To choose your points of comparison and to make your data charts, you will do some research on your two countries.

Type of speech: PowerPoint (slideshow, 8 slides, 4 data charts)
Presentation Skill: Explaining Visuals (Introduce, Explain, Emphasize, Transition) Length of speech: 3 minutes
A. Which TWO Countries will you choose?

B. What FOUR Points of Comparison will you use to compare your countries?

Examples: Population by age groups, GDP over the last 5 years, land size, number of universities, number of World Heritage sites, medals won at the Olympics, sports teams, money given to charity, etc.

6. $4^{\text {th }}$ Point of Comparison

7. Questions (4 review questions)
8. Conclusion (Name of countries and presenter name)

## D. Explaining Visuals

*(textbook, p. 60-61)
STEP 1 - Introduce "This bar graph shows the GDP of Japan and Canada."
STEP 2 - Explain "The vertical axis shows amount of rain. The horizontal axis shows the weekdays."
STEP 3 - Emphasize "The key point on this pie chart is the high percent of people over 80."
STEP 4 - Transition "Next, I will talk about the sports teams of both countries."

Don't forget to use good posture, eye contact, clear voice inflection, and gestures when making your speech. Your speech should be delivered naturally without reading your notes.
